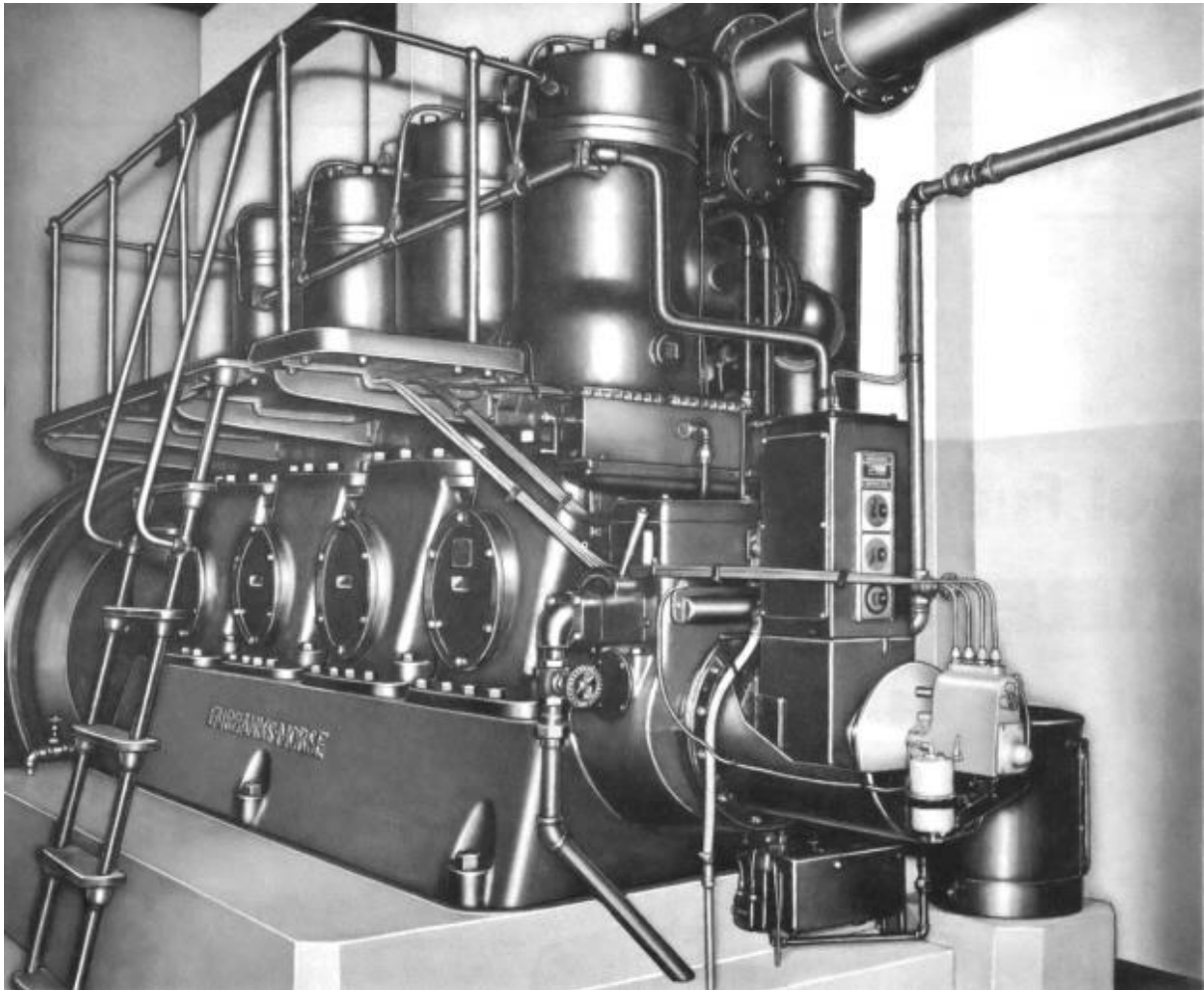

- ❖ The installation of the Fairbanks engine is progressing. Mostly we are waiting for the weather to cooperate so we can pour concrete.
  - ❖ On Saturday, December 30, 2017 a crew of members returned to South Carolina to pick up the engine and its various components.
  - ❖ Pictures were presented showing the site location, excavation and preparation work that has been completed in preparation for installing the engine. The pictures gave all a visual idea of the process and work involved to get the engine loaded and transported to our show grounds
  - ❖ A special thanks goes out to all those involved in this project. This includes members who traveled to S.C. to look at the engine and negotiate its purchase, members who traveled to prepare the engine for transport, and members who loaded and transported the engine to Newton. A special Thank You goes to Keith Schronce

for providing and driving his tractor trailer to Dacusville, SC to haul the engine. The engine is now sitting on a trailer under the Club's Pole Shed at the Fairgrounds awaiting installation. Stay tuned for additional information on the progress of this project as we move towards having the engine installed and running by show time.

- ❖ At the January meeting Kevin Black delivered a presentation on the history of the Fairbanks-Morse Company from its early days producing scales to a company that whose sales catalog spanned 800 pages – from farm engine business into commercial/industrial engine production. He gave us a good background on the Model 32 Diesel (the engine the club now owns) - its development, specifications, how it operates, and the many ways these engines were used.
  - For those of you who were not at the meeting, here is a photograph that will give you an idea of what all the talk is about. This picture shows a 4-cylinder engine, the one we now have is a 2-cylinder, but you can get a good idea of what it looks like.

-- --- --- **A thought to begin the year** --- --- ---

The New Year is here.

God established times and seasons in the beginning of time and He did so for various reasons. Some are short (days, hours), some are long (weeks, months, years), but all have one thing in common. They all have a beginning and an end.

When one day has ended, it is over and done with. When a year has passed, it is history. The events of that day, week, month, or year have passed when that period ends. We can enjoy the memory of them, learn from them, or deal with their consequences, but those past events should not rule the present.

We cannot live yesterday – it is passed. We cannot re-live it – today is today. We cannot live tomorrow – it has not happened yet. We can only live now – today is today. What he did gives us confidence that we can live today. What he will do gives us hope that we will live to see tomorrow.

What he did for us is provide us the opportunity to live today with him. He knows what we need, when we need it. He will provide what we need, teach us what we need to know and guide us in where we need to do and what we need to do.

A couple weeks ago, I saw one of our members with his wife on their way to church in his Ford model A. There is a man and woman enjoying the past, but living today, both of them together enjoying today, and doing so with their Lord! Now, that is living life!

Stop fretting over yesterday! Stop worrying about tomorrow. Don't let yesterday overwhelm you, or tomorrow stifle you. Live today! Our Lord gave everything for us, is it so much to ask to let him teach and guide us today?
