- The new weekly schedule has been announced before, but since it is so significant, we want to reiterate it again. This year, the Legion has graciously decided to scale back the Flea Market as they do during Fair week placing the sales area <u>outside</u> the midway. By doing this we now have the opportunity to begin setting up earlier in the week.
  - ✤ Grounds preparation will begin on Tuesday (mowing, speaker setup, etc.).
  - Wednesday is the day when we can start hauling in display items. (We'll be announcing exact times as we get closer.) Security will be on-sire Wednesday night.
  - On Thursday morning PLEASE DO NOT attempt to haul in while the Flea Market is going on. We do not want to do anything to jeopardize this newly acquired early set up because someone could not follow the rules. If you need to haul in on Thursday, please wait till after 3PM.
  - Security will be on-site Thursday night.
  - Friday will be a normal show day, as it always has been.
  - With the added setup time, pre-registration is needed more than ever. If you have not pre-registered, please go by the registration trailer and register when you arrive.

- If you have not pre-paid the \$25 electrical fee (payable to the American Legion), and you plan to utilize electrical power during the show, we ask that you contact Charles Bentley who will be collecting the fees.
- Golf carts will be available for rent. Rates will be the same as last year. If you want to reserve one, please call Golf Carts of Hickory (828) 855-1291 and they will have it there waiting for you. Howard Reinhardt will be coordinating all golf-carts and handicap scooters at the Country Store.
- We are always in need of assistance in quite a few areas before, during, and after the show. Mowing on Tuesday, speaker-wire setup on Tuesday evening, exhibitor ushering on Wednesday, Thursday afternoon, and Friday, ticket gate, store building, sawmill, and clean-up on Sunday, just to name a few. Please make an effort to lend a hand somewhere during the show.
- Please note, we do have a signup sheet for the gate (where admission is collected). Times are set in one hour increment so individuals do not have to spend lots of time working the gate. This was done in hopes of encouraging people sign up early, filling up the sheet. To date, over half the times slots are open. This is one of the important areas that we have to have people working. PLEASE step up and help out at the gate. It is unfair for other members to have to spend countless hours working the gate with little to no time to enjoy the show. # Foothills Antique Power Association 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Power Show May 18 – 19, 2017

- \* Tuesday, May 15 (afternoon) Initial set up of the club trailer, speakers and wiring.
- Wednesday May 16 (morning) exhibitor set up begins. No ushers will be on duty, so make sure you know where your space is. Be sure you know where your space is. If you do not have a space, or you are unsure of your location, contact Anthony Austin (828) 302-5326.
- On Thursday May 17, is Flea Market in session. DO NOT HAUL IN UNTIL AFTER THE FLEA MARKET is over (around 3 PM). Anyone available to lend a hand helping with Flea Market clean-up is encouraged to do so.
- Spaces in the main exhibit area may be reserved by members in good standing (dues paid). These spaces are to be occupied by 12 noon on Friday May 19 or they will be forfeited for the duration of the show (unless your intent to fill them after that time is communicated to the reserved space coordinator – Anthony Austin (828) 302-5326).
- ✤ All members are to be aware of and adhere to the safety requirements for the show.
- All members are called upon to function as safety monitors by presenting your own exhibits in a safe manner and helping each other do the same.
  - All equipment is to be chocked when parked. Chocks are available if you have none.
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Fire extinguishers are to be ready at hand.
  - Be aware of and yield to pedestrians when driving any vehicle on the grounds.
  - Demonstrations should be roped-off to keep little fingers on little hands where they belong.
- Plenty of parking is available, but we need to utilize it wisely.
  - Trailers should be parked in the area behind the livestock barn.
  - Towing vehicles should be parked in the general parking area.
  - The area next to the pulling track is for pullers (Friday & Saturday)
- ✤ All exhibitors are highly encouraged to register.
- All exhibitors are encouraged to operate their equipment during the show except for two specific times. During these times, we ask that all vehicles and equipment. be OFF.
  - During opening ceremonies on Saturday morning.
  - During Sunday morning church services.
- The route for the Parade of Power will be marked off with signs. Everyone should begin by exiting the Main Exhibit area through the pulling track parking area, cross the main road and proceed through the main parking area to the back gate. DO NOT proceed into the food court area until directed.
- ✤ This is <u>our</u> show. That means <u>we</u> are host to the public and to those who come to exhibit with us. It is up to every one of us to do what we can to make it a memorable experience for all who come. Each member is encouraged to do their part no task is too small or menial to be worthwhile and every person is worthy of a smile or a helping hand.
